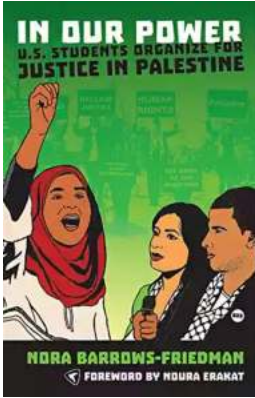

Joining the Movement

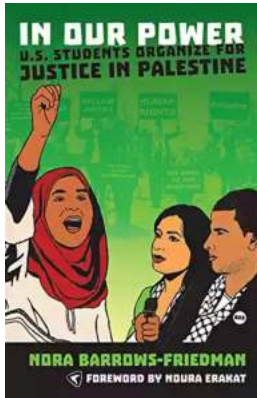
